
Pauline Reeves Gallery – May Exhibit

Although the majority of her painting is done on location en plein air, she also works in her studio creating larger paintings from her outdoor field studies. Painting throughout the country and especially the south Florida area, she gets her inspiration from her surroundings. Her love of nature and the outdoors comes through in the subject matter of her paintings, which show the tranquility and beauty that she finds in pristine places and everyday scenes.

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
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
